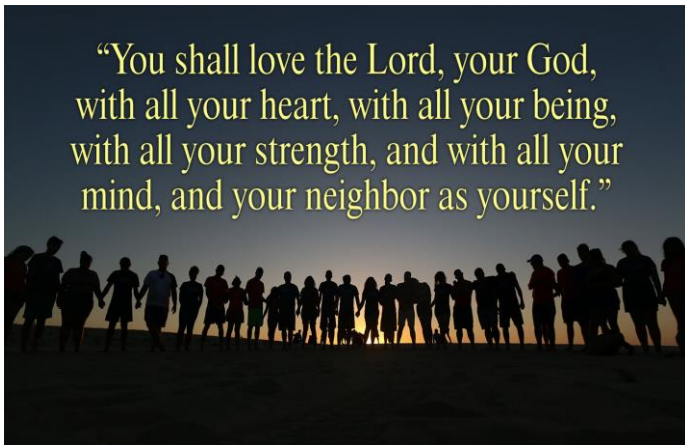

FR. RUDY'S DESK

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Risen Lord,

I am writing this message for the first time to all of you who comprise the five communities of our new family of parishes. As you know, we have begun a new journey among our parishes in accordance with the Beacons of Light process. This Beacons of Light process will take several years to shape and refine toward one faith community—a community that shares personnel, resources, and more focus “on mission than on maintenance,” as Archbishop Dennis M. Schnurr said as this process was introduced.

Our new family of parishes is characterized by cultural and religious diversity. We come from all over the world and have different cultural backgrounds. However, we are united in the Risen Lord. St. Paul says, “For through faith you are all children of God in Jesus Christ. For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free person, there is not male and female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus.” (Gal 3:26-28)

This diversity among our communities is our strength and richness. It may sometimes become an obstacle for the unity of our communities if we embrace it only as a human experience. However, our diversity can be a healthy and positive journey if we embrace it as a spiritual journey and allow Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit to lead us. We certainly will need every one of us to participate in this new community; no one should remain idle.

The “success” of our journey as a new family of parishes will depend on our availability and openness to the Holy Spirit, who will lead us through new pathways. As Pastor, I will keep my eyes fixed on the Good Shepherd who said, “I have come to serve, not to be served.” (Matthew 20:28) – Fr. Rudy

- To grandparents, the elderly, and the faithful who participate on July 24 in the solemn celebration that Pope Francis will preside over in the Vatican, or in the various functions that take place throughout the world.
- To the faithful who, on the same day, devote adequate time to visit in person or virtually through the media, their disabled brothers and sisters in need or in difficulty.
- To the sick, elderly, and to all those who, unable to leave their homes for a serious reason, will unite spiritually with the sacred services of the World Day, offering to God their prayers, the pains and suffering of their lives, especially while the words of Pope Francis and the various celebrations are broadcast through the media.

The grants and indulgences are made under the usual conditions of sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion and prayers for the intentions of the Pope.
