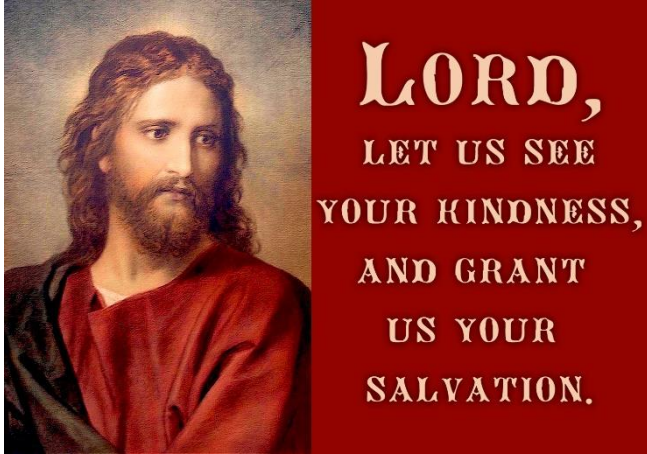

From the Editor's Desk

HOSPITALITY: An article in the *Catholic Telegraph* this month speaks of hospitality. Nicholas Hardesty, Archdiocesan Center for the New Evangelization, says: "radical hospitality means making someone feel welcomed, valued and affirmed far beyond expectations. It's a hospitality that doesn't count the cost. It's a yes to the prospect of the other that establishes the other as the highest good." This type of hospitality reminds me of the importance of making all people feel welcomed here at St. Boniface. In particular, I am referring to the Hispanic community who have been part of St. Boniface for nearly two years. It seems to me we are two different groups sharing the same buildings – not one parish family. Of course, there are differences; i.e., language, customs, ways we celebrate liturgy, to name a few. If we truly are the Body of Christ, why haven't we more fully embraced the differences and incorporated them into a unified, unique parish family. COVID-19 cut a year out of our progress, but that doesn't mean we can't start again to offer hospitality, to embrace each other as brothers and sisters in Christ. Hardesty goes on to state, "in a society that fosters egocentricity ..., it's rare to be truly welcomed. It's rare to be treated with the dignity you deserve. It's rare to be genuinely loved – and, at the end of the day that's all anyone wants." We are called to be People of God, to be one in faith and practice, to be a family, to make each other truly welcomed. I believe it's time to start making this happen at St. Boniface.
