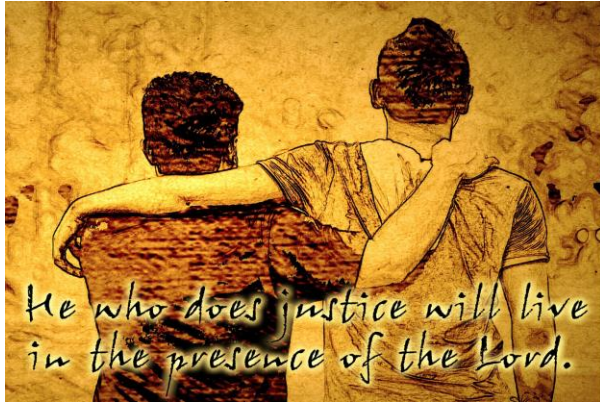

The **Education Fund** is a way to help students who need financial help with tuition (children in elementary or high school, or adults studying at the Athenaeum for ministry in the Parish).

The **Improvement Fund** is something we use for major repairs/renovations to the physical needs of our parish. Our ancestors left us a beautiful heritage with their dreams of 150 years ago. This fund has allowed

us to continue to maintain and improve the beauty of our beloved church and grounds.

FROM THE SAFE ENVIRONMENT OFFICE:

With Summer activities in full swing, we would like to remind all parish/school employees and volunteers of the requirements of the Decree on Child Protection. All employees and volunteers are required to have completed The Archdiocese of Cincinnati SafeParish™: Protecting Children From Sexual Abuse - Arch. of Cincinnati Edition training or child protection training under the prior child protection platform (VIRTUS). Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish™ quarterly bulletins.

As of July 8, there are 10,000+ SafeParish user accounts that are pending termination due to lack of compliance in completing the quarterly bulletins. With the school year beginning for most in August, please make sure to complete the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish account is approved. Please direct questions regarding bulletin completion to your parish/school safe environment coordinator.

MINISTRY TO SURVIVORS OF ABUSE

(REPORTING): The Archdiocese of Cincinnati regards child abuse in all its forms as gravely sinful and criminal. Anyone who knows of or suspects child abuse by a legitimate member of the clergy or hierarchy, employee, or volunteer of the archdiocese should first report the abuse to the appropriate secular legal authority and then to Ms. Teresa Maley, Coordinator of Ministry to Survivors of Abuse of the Archdiocese, at 513-263-6623.
