**ST. VINCENT DE PAUL:** Thanks so much for your donations to the St. Boniface Food Pantry team "The Shepherds of St. Boniface" in the Hunger Walk. Stephanie Heidemann organized her team and had great fun at the walk this year. Your generosity has given us a \$1,500 credit at The Free Store Food Bank. Thanks, too, for your donations of school supplies. We will be distributing back packs filled with supplies at the food pantry in August.

Have you ever considered helping out at the pantry? We could certainly use your help. You could work one Saturday each month or just help once in a while when needed. Our pantry hours are on Saturday from 1:00 - 3:00 p.m. We get there at 12:00 noon to get everything ready to go and we are out by 3:15 p.m. If you would like to see how the pantry operates, please stop by and we can show you what we do. **SOUND SYSTEM IN CHURCH:** We have all experienced difficulty in hearing the Mass in the last few years. Our staff has been investigating various sources and has contracted with a Sound Engineer who specializes in older Catholic Churches to replace our entire system with one that will correct the problems. We are looking at \$25,000 for the new system and hope many of you will consider investing in this improvement to our celebration of the Eucharist. We are hoping to have the new system installed by the end of September.

**SOMETHING TO CONSIDER:** Do you have to take a "Required Minimum Distribution" out of your retirement account every year. You can donate part of your RMD directly to St. Boniface and it will reduce your tax liability. It doesn't matter whether you itemize your taxes or not to reduce the tax. Talk to your investment company about making the arrangements. Another possibility is to remember St. Boniface in your will. The future of our parish depends on our generosity.

**BECOMING MORE INVOLVED IN THE PARISH LIFE OF ST. BONIFACE:** St. Boniface parishioners are asked to step forward and take a more proactive role in Parish life. Most of us can do something to show our commitment to our Parish – to our spiritual home. Many of us have very active lives; some our homebound and can't physically come to church on Sunday let alone clean up flower beds or clean the church or stuff envelopes. But we can do our part by praying for our brothers and sisters in Christ. We hope, over the next few months, to inform you of opportunities for you to be of service.
