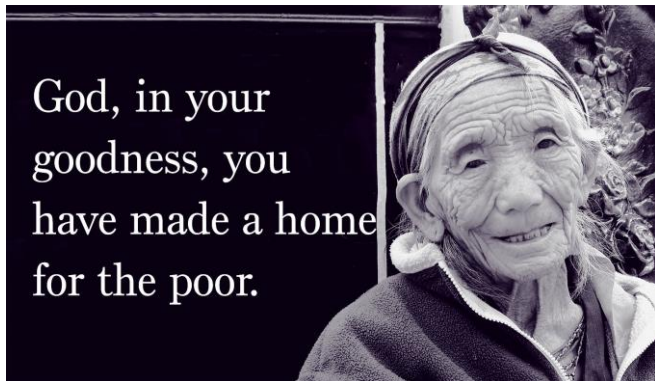

FROM THE DESK OF FR. RUDY:

It is the Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time, and we focus on two themes: how to exercise humility and Jesus' call for compassion to the marginalized, who cannot respond in kind. In Luke's Gospel today, Jesus links these concepts together to help us see how God *sees* his children and to offer a path so we may be counted among the "resurrection of the righteous." (Luke 14: 14)

When one thinks of selflessness, who better comes to mind but St Teresa of Calcutta, who had an unlimited capacity to give people unconditional love. She said this about humility: "These are the few ways we can practice humility: To speak as little as possible of oneself. To mind one's own business. Not to want to manage other people's affairs. To avoid curiosity. To accept contradictions and correction cheerfully. To pass over the mistakes of others. To accept insults and injuries. To accept being slighted, forgotten and disliked. To be kind and gentle even under provocation. Never to stand on one's dignity. To choose always the hardest."

Would you describe yourself as being kind and gentle? These are beautiful words, but do you fully embrace their meaning? It's something we all should think about and hold in one's heart.

Today, as it was in ancient times, some of us are preoccupied with social status based on money, power, and prestige, among others. From the "influencers on social media, to the titans of industry, to those VIPs we might know personally, we symbolically place these individuals in seats of honor at our own "table" in terms of our time and interest. However, Jesus has asked us, instead, to beckon "the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind" to honored seats, so we may honor and serve Him and those in need.

In other words, "Let no one ever come to you without leaving better and happier. Be the living expression of God's kindness: kindness in your face, kindness in your eyes, kindness in your smile." —St. Teresa of Calcutta
