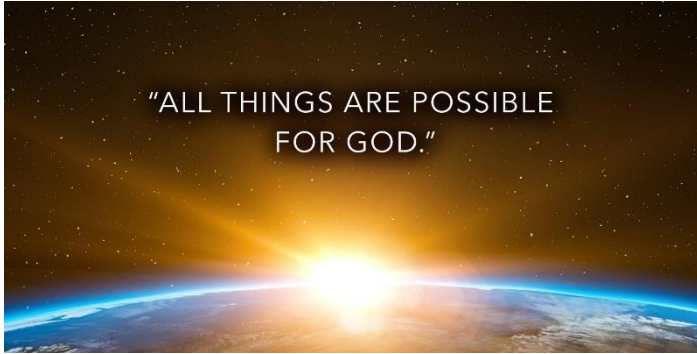

### **BECOMING MORE INVOLVED IN THE PARISH LIFE OF ST. BONIFACE:**

This week we are spotlighting the Archdiocese's plan for how our parishes will be restructured in the coming year. Your input is so vital in how St. Boniface will be affected. This is something you can do, we all can do, if we want St. Boniface to continue to adequately serve the people of this community.

**BEACONS OF LIGHT:** The Archdiocese has submitted the first draft for the Families of Parishes, the first phase of the Beacons of Light pastoral planning process. It is beneficial for all of us at St. Boniface to go to the website before October 20 to give feedback on how our parish will be affected. The plan as of now is for St. Boniface, St. Leo, St. Bernard in Winton Place, and St. Joseph in the West End to be our Family. As you are already aware, the San Carlos Community joined with us two years ago. Here are a few things to consider as you give your feedback.

- 1) St. Boniface is a diverse parish and we welcome all people.
- 2) When reviewing the numbers on the Beacons of Light website, multiple people noticed our numbers are not current. Because of Covid, the Archdiocese used all of the churches' numbers from 2019. However, our church grew quite a bit at the end of 2019 when the San Carlos community joined.

- 3) Not only should we offer feedback, we should also consider offering possible solutions. If one of these churches ends up going with a different family, who would be a good alternative and why?

Ministering to our entire new family will be a lot of work over the next few years. Please keep our staff and fellow parishioners in your prayers as we go through this process.

The proposed draft is now posted for you to view on the Beacons of Light website. Please be sure to visit [BeaconsAOC.org](http://BeaconsAOC.org) before Wednesday, October 20, to study the plan and provide your feedback in the comment box available on the site. Your thoughtful input at this stage of the planning process would be most valuable.

If you are unable to access the website and wish to find out more, there will be a **feedback meeting at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 13**. This meeting is only for those who cannot access the internet. We hope people can go online themselves and submit their feedback whether positive or negative. On October 13, Fr. Jim and Jenni will hear non-internet user's feedback and submit it on their behalf. **Your voice is important and we need to be heard.**
