WORSHIP TOGETHER SAFELY (Covid 19): Per the Archdiocese as of March 12, 2021: We recognize that the coronavirus pandemic, despite positive trends and widespread vaccinations, is far from over. For that reason, the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and other holy days of obligation will remain in place for the foreseeable future to not unduly burden the consciences of those who have serious health concerns, either for themselves or for someone in their immediate care. The health and safety of our communities continues to be of paramount importance. However, for those who are able to safely return, we wholeheartedly look forward to worshipping with you in person once more.

In all circumstances, the regulations put forth by public health authorities must be observed (e.g. masks, social distancing, cleaning, etc.)

 Consistent with Gov. DeWine's July 2020 order on the wearing of masks in public places, it is expected that masks are worn at all times in church. Priests, deacons, readers, and cantors may (if socially distant from others) remove their mask while speaking or singing, but masks must be worn while in procession throughout the church and especially during the distribution of Holy Communion.
