### REFLECTION BY FATHER RUDY

# We must open our hearts to the divine mystery of faith

We've all heard it said, "Everyone loves mystery," and as a result, we read mystery novels, tune in to Masterpiece Theatre Mystery, follow crime podcasts, and attend mystery night events to stir our imagination and curiosity about life. Although not stressed by psychologists, a human being's fascination with mystery is a complex, core emotion that is behind our

desire to learn and our yearning to find out the answer to life's questions. If you think about it, curiosity is tied to some of our greatest accomplishments, such as going to the moon and exploring new methods and procedures to increase our knowledge of science, art, and spirituality. But also connected to our sense of mystery is our need to explain, define, understand, and find meaning in life—we ultimately want to know the who, what, when, where, why, and how of something or someone. We pursue it because we are compelled to learn its truth.

Today's feast, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, celebrates the Christian doctrine of the three persons of God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Pope John XXII established this feast in the fourteenth century to commemorate our abiding belief in the mystery of the Triune God who dwells within each of us. We share in God's divinity and power as believers, and consequently, we are given

his magnificent grace "for God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish, but have eternal life." Although we, as humans, cannot possibly grasp the depth of this concept's magnitude, we believe *there are* truly three persons of God because we walk by faith and not by sight. It is a mystery to us, yes, but one we accept without reservation. It is our truth. It is our faith.

It is also true for us to understand that as we trust in God and continue to build our intimate relationship with him, the more he will reveal himself to us. If we seek him in faith and imitate his love in all that we do, his mystery and our uncertainties will fade away. We must open our hearts, our love, and our trust in him, and we will truly see his light.
