FR. RUDY'S REFLECTION: A woman sits quietly at the kitchen table before dawn. The house is still, the coffee warm in her hand. Her day ahead is full—work, errands, caregiving—but for this brief moment, she prays. She doesn't say much. Just the *Our Father*. Slowly, reverently. It's not a new habit, but a steady one. She prays not because it fixes everything but because it keeps her anchored, focused, and humble. It reminds her that someone else is in charge—and that He is good.

In this Sunday's Gospel, the disciples watch Jesus pray and then ask him a very human question: "Lord, teach us to pray." In response, Jesus gives them—and us—the most foundational and perfect prayer: the Our Father. It is short, simple, and infinitely rich. But Jesus doesn't stop at giving us words. He teaches us about prayer itself: how to pray, what to ask for, and how God answers.

First, we learn that God gives us more than we ask for—not less. That's easy to forget. We might feel discouraged when our prayers seem unanswered, but perhaps the real problem is that we expect too little. We often come to prayer unsure, distracted, or defeated. Yet Jesus tells us to pray with trust and persistence, like the neighbor in the parable who knocks at midnight. God isn't annoyed by our prayers; He welcomes them. He listens. He responds. Still, we don't always get what we want—and that's because God gives us what we need. Jesus says plainly, "Your Father knows what you need before you ask Him" (Matthew 6:8). He is not a vending machine for blessings, but a loving Father.

Sometimes, in His wisdom, He withholds certain things or allows hardship because He sees the whole picture. And yes, even suffering, if we love and trust God, can work for our good. That doesn't make pain easier, but it gives it meaning.

So what do we truly need? Jesus answers that in the Lord's Prayer. The first and greatest need is for God's name to be glorified. We were made for Him. Our souls find peace only when we are praising and loving Him. That's why we begin with, "Hallowed be thy name." Next, we pray for our daily bread—not tomorrow's wealth or ease, but today's sustenance:

strength, forgiveness, peace, and trust. God always grants that prayer, in ways we may not expect but always for our benefit. The Lord's Prayer is not just something we recite. It is a way of life. It shapes our hearts to love God first and to trust Him with all else. It teaches us humility, patience, and faith. In the end, what God wants most is not our perfect words, but our presence, our persistence, and our trust.
