REFLECTION BY FR. RUDY

Today is the Feast of Christ the King, the last Sunday of the liturgical year, in which Our Lord Jesus

Christ's kingship is celebrated in Matthew's Gospel with a final parable of God's kingdom in a broken world. In this chilling, apocalyptic parable that metaphorically describes humankind as goats and sheep that are

ultimately separated and judged through the lens of God's sovereignty and by the way he instructs us to live. This passage is especially poignant given the backdrop of violence, corruption, despair, and inhumanity that continues to infect our world, especially at this particular moment in time. We can and must live better lives, lives dedicated to Jesus Christ as the Good Shephard whose life and ministry showed us the path to eternal salvation.

The Feast of Christ the King, instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI, responded to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever. It encourages us to celebrate and live out our faith in a public way.

In this context, I ask you to examine your conscience each day and ask yourself: Is Jesus truly the King of my life? And second, with an open and compassionate heart, am I participating in his mission here on earth? The atrocities we are seeing on television these days and the mind-numbing unkindness we are witnessing show the hunger, thirst, loneliness, alienation, and hate that seem to be enveloping the world. In this regard, are you a shepherd or a goat? Are you operating in tandem

with Christ in a spirit of compassion, grace, and mercy toward others, or are you clothed in moral superiority, self-piety, and egocentrism? Look within, move out of yourself toward other people, in what they need and what you can do to help them, and you will find a joy you cannot imagine. Whether it is in performing small acts of kindness or with a great transformation of heart by helping to relieve some form of tragic suffering in the world, living with mercy and compassion is what Jesus is asking us all to do to live out our Baptism. We participate in his kingdom by our love.
