Stewardship Report to the Parish

January through March the food pantry served 843 persons (121 Seniors, 382 Adults and 340 Children) from 282 households. We were able to help those in need thanks to the generous financial and in-kind support of St. Boniface Parishioners, many who contributed to our 40 Days of Lent Appeal, St. Ann and Bank Street SVdP's, Kroger, the St. Boniface Vincentians and their families/friends. We did lose the Mt. Airy Kroger donations when that store closed. The estimated value of the donated items is \$ 4,500.

Our Active and Associate Vincentians gave over 340 hours of service to our neighbors and non-Vincentians contributed 88 hours of service. Unfortunately when schools closed due to the pandemic, the St. Ursula H.S. and Badin H.S. volunteers had to stop helping in the pantry. They are missed. Efforts this quarter includes:

- 11 Home visits were made directly impacting the lives of 23 people plus 25 other in person visits assisting 89 people. (With the SVDP Retail Stores closed due to coronavirus, we are not able to issue vouchers at this time.)
- 20 Clothing/housewares vouchers were issued
- 5 Furniture vouchers were issued
- 9 Families received bed vouchers (2 remain on the waiting list until SVdP stores reopen)



- 3 Families received rent assistance
- 7 Families received utility assistance
- 2 Girls from 1 family received twin beds donated by Morris Home Furniture
- Food Pantry remains open at this time as a drive-thru in the new church parking lot.
 Donations still needed of food, personal care, and cleaning supplies.
- Phone calls were made to plan visits, arrange for vouchers or other assistance and refer to correct SVDP conferences or appropriate service agencies

• Conference and SVDP Pantry Network meetings, Freestore Foodbank pick-ups and storage, preparing bags of food and personal care items, and shopping with/for neighbors in the Saturday Food Pantry. We are responding to calls at this time, but are not making home visits due to Covid19.
