Stewardship Report to the Parish

The St. Boniface SVDP Food Pantry remains open as a drive-thru in the lower church parking lot. October through December we served 954 persons (121 Seniors, 434 Adults and 399 Children) from 284 households. We were able to help those in need thanks to the generous financial and in-kind support of St. Boniface Parishioners, Iglesia Catolica San Carlos, St. Ann and Bank Street SVDP's, Kroger, Midwest Community Fundraising, St. Xavier and LaSalle High Schools and the St. Boniface Vincentians and their families and friends. We appreciate all the help we received during the Thanksgiving Food Drive. Also, we received a large donation of personal care items through a grant awarded to the Cincinnati SVDP District Council. The estimated value of all the donated items is \$8,400.

Our Vincentians gave over 340 hours of service to our neighbors and non-Vincentians from St. Ursula and Badin High Schools contributed 118 hours of service.

Ministry this quarter included:

- "Phone visits" to provide assistance to our neighbors or refer them to other agencies
- 14 Furniture vouchers to the SVDP stores were issued plus 5 delivery vouchers
- 29 Clothing/Houseware vouchers to the SVDP stores were issued
- 11 Coat vouchers to the SVDP stores were issued
- 11 Families received bed vouchers from the Bob and Sylvia Rahe Bed Fund
- 5 Families received rent assistance plus 1 family received mortgage assistance
- 10 Families received utility assistance
- 2 Families received additional financial assistance through the Conference Assistance Fund
- Christmas cards were sent and phone calls were made to homebound parishioners
- ZOOM SVDP National and District meetings to keep up informed, motivated and to partake in Christmas fellowship; ZOOM Freestore Food Bank meeting to maintain our Partner Agency status; ordering, delivering, sorting/storing food from FSFB, St. X HS, LaSalle HS, and Kroger; assembling food and personal care bags; working at the Saturday Food Pantry distribution
