Jesus is our one and only treasure

My Sisters and Brothers in the Risen Lord,

It seems in this fast-paced, ever-changing world, we have reasons to cling onto those things that make us feel connected to something or someone that gives us a sense of permanence and inexpressible peace of mind. They are our treasures, and we hold onto them in our hearts without much thought as to why they mean so much to us. For example, some of us as children or even adults, retain a treasure box filled with items we have collected over the years that help us relive wonderful moments in our lives.
